## **Outline Syllabus**

- 1. Front-loaded concentration on reading and writing skills.
- 2. Writing skills, paragraphing and internal organisation, notes, summaries, descriptive essays and reports.
- 3. Reading texts of up to 800 words, developing skills of skimming and scanning alongside intensive reading for information; vocabulary an grammar awareness.
- 4. Listening for information, to take notes and to engage in discourse; use of single voices or simple multi-voice interaction.
- 5. Speaking linked with listening as an interactive skill, seeking information, help and quidance.
- 6. Appropriate points of grammar covered, including, but not exclusively, simple and continuous tense forms, active versus passive voice, article use, prepositions of time and place, comparative and superlative forms.
