Outline Syllabus

- 1. Extend and develop skills acquired in FES1.
- 2. Writing skills longer texts, with ideas explained (and with some, limited, evaluation). Discursive essays, presenting an argument and using a range of supporting data, including charts, graphs etc.
- 3. Reading skills longer texts and increased reading load; ability to differentiate fact from opinion and judging relevance; continued vocabulary enhancement.
- 4. Listening and then participation in discourse, judging information with opinion supported by some, limited, evidence.
- 5. Speaking skills active participant, instigator of discourse, ability to deliver a short talk on a selected topic.
- 6. Grammar points future and perfect tenses, sequence and process markers, anaphoric and cataphonic referencing.
