Aims

The module is designed to provide the non-specialist student with a range of singing skills as soloist and in small and large ensembles. The module is also designed as a foundation for the students future development in vocals and performance. Ensemble Singing is concerned with the study and practice of varying aspects of choral performance within a range of stylistic and idiomatic contexts. The module provides an opportunity to rehearse and perform in a variety of ensembles and environments.

Individual singing technique is concerned with developing individual vocal skills, including an base level understanding of the vocal processes and health issues associated with singing.

After completing the module the student should be able to:

- 1 Employ basic technical, creative, improvisational and interpretative singing performance skills
- 2 Demonstrate basic awareness of the stylistic characteristics of a range of musical genres/repertoire and ability to perform in a variety of musical styles
- Apply a basic understanding of vocal processes in demonstrating the ability to sing in a healthy manner
- Employ basic knowledge of rehearsal, presentation and performance techniques, and the ability to work collaboratively as an effective team member

Outline Syllabus

The module provides a range of performance opportunities: opportunities to apply and consolidate basic music skills; developing preparation and presentation skills appropriate to musical performance. The module also develops general performance skills (ie, teamwork, collaboration, giving and receiving direction) and strengthens complementary rhythmic and vocal performance skills.

Weekly tutor-led rehearsals in a large group format allows students to develop a range of skills including: aural and articulation, receiving musical direction, sight reading/singing, vocal and performance technique, harmony, counterpoint and a a knowledge of the existing repertoire.

Module work will provide the basis for performances and assessment of vocal abilities. Students also receive small group vocal tuition following a clearly defined syllabus designed to guide student's techincal and stylistic development. Learning is consolidated through self-directed study and individual practice.

Learning Activities

This module consists of providing a number of rehearsal and performance opportunities within the choral genre. This will include large cast chorus groups and smaller a cappella ensembles. Students will be introduced to a range of songs in a

variety of styles to broaden the scope of performance experience. Students improve technique and musicality through practical stylistic study covering a range of musical idioms.

Notes

Assessment strategy – there are mid-year and year-end summative assessment points, and formative assessment on an ongoing basis.
