#### **Outline Syllabus**

This is a student centred module which responds to the differing needs of individual students and their choices regarding their progression after the IAB. The module will explore

• The range of employment opportunities available in the performing arts. This will explore both performance and non-performance roles.

• The training and education opportunities available for those seeking a career in the performing arts

The module will then go on to support the student in

• In selecting progression institutions and completing application forms.

• Developing audition material according to their chosen direction (audition songs / monologues etc)

#### **Learning Activities**

The module delivery activities are in two parts. Part one focuses on lectures and seminar discussions where options and opportunities are discussed and evaluated. This part also includes one to one tutorials.

Part Two focuses on the development of audition material according to the needs of individual students – the support will be given in group workshop and one to tone tutorials.
