Aims

Outline Syllabus

The students will explore the nature and scope of the performing arts economy, principally though not exclusively focused on theatre including:

- Nature and economic structure of commercial theatre
- Nature and economic structure of subsidised theatre
- Drama and theatre in educational and social contexts
- Working practices in the professional theatre (key roles etc)
- Trade unions and professional associations
- Auditions, contracts, employment law, casting directors and agents
- Taxation and the self-employed
- Copyright
- Venues and performance
- National and local government and the performing arts

• Marketing and career development

- Workshops and classes both in whole group and sub-groups
- Lectures and demonstrations
- Independent and guided research exercises and presentations
- Audio /Video screenings and presentations and the watching of live performance
- In class / Institutional performances / sharings
