## **Outline Syllabus**

The module provides the student with a broad overview of the performing arts in the UK, both as a commercial activity and an arts practice

Training for the Performing Arts;

The Music Business

Dance in the UK (Commercial and Subsidised);

Theatre in the UK (Commercial and Subsidised);

Employment in the Performing Arts Economy (key roles etc);

Self-employment

The Arts Council and other funding bodies;

There are two assessment points to this module:

Students, in groups, will develop a presentation proposal for an event considering their target audience, planning, budgeting and fundraising and the marketing of the event. They will reflect on this activity by means of a 2000 word essay.

Students will submit a portfolio that will include a CV, a personal statement a variety of appropriate audition material and any other material necessary for applications to Performing Arts HE courses or for a career as a self-employed artist.

### **Learning Activities**

The primary delivery method will be seminars and workshops. Through the module students will be encouraged to develop deep learning through participation in debates and seminar presentations. All seminars will be designed to encourage dialogue and will, where appropriate, be based on student's own interests and directions.
