## **Outline Syllabus**

Students will be introduced to the anatomy and physiology of the voice so as to be aware of the process of vocal production and safe vocal practices – this will include both the actors and singers voice. The students will be introduced to the key elements of posture, alignment, breathing, relaxation, range, rhythm, resonance.

#### Voice

Students will explore the technical and physical skills of the voice of the actor (projection, breath etc.) and the communicative and expressive potential of the actor's voice in the creation and exploration of character. The student will be introduced to a range of appropriate texts through which they can explore and develop the vocal challenges implicit in them. In the early stages of the module time will be spent exploring speech and phonetics so as to ensure clarity and clear articulation.

### Singing

In singing students will explore a range of technical vocal skills required for singing including and isolating any vocal issues the student may have. Studies will include an exploration of: range, pitch, rhythm, resonance, projection, articulation, harmony and musicality.

Students will be asked to explore and evaluate their vocal range, develop their

musical ear and gain an understanding of basic music theory. The module will utilize a range of songs from a variety of genre (musical theatre, religious, popular music and choral).

# **Learning Activities**

The module will be delivered via

- 1. Workshops and classes both in whole group and sub-groups
- 2. Lectures and demonstrations
- 3. Independent and guided research exercises and presentations
- 4. Audio /Video screenings and presentations and the watching of live performance
- 5. In class / Institutional performances / sharings

#### **Notes**

The module introduces students to Voice skills for the actor and enables them to consider their voice as a tool. Assessment is via two portfolios.
