# **Outline Syllabus**

The module is structured around the development and presentation of a workshop performance. The module draws together the skills, knowledge, and experience developed elsewhere in the programme and provides students with the opportunity to put theory into practice. The focus of the module is on exploring the processes leading to performance (planning, rehearsal etc) and not simply the performance itself. The module has four phases:

Planning and research Rehearsal techniques Performance Critical appraisal

The module is heavily tutor directed, with students being encouraged to explore each phase of the production process. Throughout the module, students will be required to keep a production casebook /logbook in which they reflect on the process and their understanding of the development of the production. This is then translated into a short critical appraisal (1000 words).

#### **Learning Activities**

The module is based around the development of one (or more) piece of performed work. The students will undertake major roles within the process, under close staff supervision. Normally the production will be staff directed.

The module will primarily be taught through workshops, however, specific elements may be delivered through lectures and seminars and one to one tutorials.

ASSESSMENT STRATEGY

Students are assessed on their contribution and focus in rehearsal and on their performance. The casebook/logbook could also be used to inform the mark awarded for ongoing assessment and is the basis for the short critical appraisal of their work.
