Aims

The module is designed to provide students with a range of vocal or instrumental skills as a soloist and in small and large ensembles. The module is designed to provide a rigorous foundation for the student's future development as instrumental or vocal performers.

The module aims to develop general performance-related skills such as study/practice, rehearsal, preparation and presentation skills. It provides and opportunity to rehearse and perform in a variety of ensembles and environments. The module also aims to foster a broad understanding of a range of performance-related subjects including style, interpretation, improvisation and musical analysis.

Outline Syllabus

The module provides a range of performance opportunities; opportunities to apply and consolidate core music skills; developing preparation and presentation skills appropriate to musical performance. The module also develops general performance skills (ie, teamwork, collaboration, giving and receiving direction) and strengthens complementary rhythmic, vocal and instrumental performance skills.

Weekly tutor-led rehearsals in a band context allow students to develop a range of skills including: aural analysis, ear training, receiving musical direction, a music reading, musicality/interpretation, improvisation, stylistic awareness and an expanded knowledge of the existing repertoire. Module work will provide the basis for performances and assessment of both solo and ensemble work.

Learning Activities

Students receive one-to-one vocal/instrumental tuition following a clearly defined syllabus designed to guide student's technical and stylistic development. Weekly rehearsals in a band context enhancing ensemble skills. Learning is consolidated through self directed study and individual practice. Weekly masterclasses by industry professionals enhance knowledge in a variety of performance-related topics.

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
