This module aims to facilitates the successful transition of the student into Higher Education and develop the skills for

academic study at level 4. The acquisition of these skills will enable the student to develop the underpinning knowledge to

undertake the care of patients with a variety of needs. The module will introduce the student to the concept of professional values and how these will impact on their attitude and behaviour in the nursing associate role. In order to prepare students for the role of the Nursing Associate in a contemporary workforce students will develop the skills of resilience through the recognition of their own assets, self awareness and reflective practice. The care management of patients will be explored with consideration given to practices which underpin the delivery of safe and effective care. This will be achieved through building a fundamental understanding of applied anatomy and physiology, principles underpinning holistic person centred care and developing communication skills.

Learning will be facilitated through appropriate learning environments including the clinical skills centre and

classroom activities. Approaches to learning and teaching include a breadth of skills and simulation equipment that will

engage students in, and provide feedback mechanisms for their skills development including lead lectures which will

provide a forum to enable students development, underpinning knowledge and principles of practical skills.

Students will undertake a feedforward exercise and produce a short piece of work, supported by the literature, to develop

academic writing skills and digital literacies. This will be submitted via turnitin on the VLE to allow students to experience the submission process. Feedback will be provided in a timely manner via turnitin enabling students to develop their writing skills prior to summative submissions.
