#### **Outline Syllabus**

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• Block 1 – Context: Philosophical, Political, Organisational, Legislative and Policy

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• Block 2 – Theory and Policy Perspectives

This module will examine the need for the police service to adopt new technology against the background of the patchy take-up of technology such as social media by police in the UK and EU. The module will provide students with a clear background to the confident use of Information Technology (IT) in an academic and professional setting whilst also considering the divisions between social and professional. The module will explore the use of technology to provide effective policing solutions to crime prevention and detection in the context of key policing priorities on local, national and international levels. The threat and implications of "cyber-crime" on an international level will be introduced in this module.

#### **Learning Activities**

The module will utilise blended learning, which will combine e-learning with more traditional teaching strategies. In addition students will be encouraged to monitor their own learning in this module through their Personal Development Plans. Lectures and online learning materials will be used to provide an overview of each topic. The lectures will be delivered by the module team and, on occasion, guest speakers from different relevant professional backgrounds, with particular expertise in aspects of the curriculum. Workshops will be used as a space for students to explore and discuss issues in small groups.

Electronic seminar and project work (such as on-line synchronous and asynchronous forums and blogs) will be used to further explore the issues raised in lectures and through the students own research.

Students will be expected to engage in self-directed learning to develop their knowledge of the field.
