Outline Syllabus

Drawing on local collections and arts institutions Museums on Merseyside examines the history of collecting, the politics of display and the formation of local museums and art galleries. Lectures will be supplemented by case studies and workshop sessions at the relevant museums and galleries. Typical lecture and seminar content will include: Collections in the City: Forming National and Provincial Identity The Politics of Display The Visitor Experience New Uses for Old Spaces: Art and Urban Regeneration Art in Public Spaces The Liverpool Biennial of Contemporary Art Speke Hall to Menlove Avenue: The Heritage Industry on Merseyside The Museum Professional; Alternative Spaces for Display.

Students will learn how to organise & structure a progress file, document and archive coursework, and identify key action points for future development.

Learning Activities

Lectures explore generic historical and contemporary examples of collections and display with reference to museums on Merseyside. Seminars will introduce students to key debates and issues in the politics of collecting and display. The module is augmented by talks from professional curators, education officers, conservationist and marketing staff.

This module introduces students to the first components of the Personal

Development Portfolio, which aims to help them become more effective, independent confident and self-directed learners.
