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## **Outline Syllabus**

*A series of workshops to provoke personal and individual interpretation and development to given tasks. Depending upon pathway specialism, students will undertake:*

*DESIGN: a run of fashion photographs styled and captured on location using the garments created in LSAFD1002*

*COMMUNICATION: a series of styled studio based fashion photographs exploiting the values of identity through attitude, composition and lighting.*

*These activities will raise photographic representational issues in respect of the style and image by encouraging students to challenge convention and take risks in their own representations.*

## **Learning Activities**

A series of workshops to promote a personal and individual interpretation by encouraging students to challenge convention and take risks when executing and manipulating fashion photography. The module takes a broad view of the practice of styling, capturing and manipulating fashion photography and affords students the potential for a lot of creative freedom.

Students exploration of their photographic activity will be supported through individual and group seminars. On-going informal feedback will be available in the weekly practical sessions.
