### **Outline Syllabus**

The module is made up of two parts – singing and music theory The module will start with each student undergoing an individual personal vocal evaluation whereby key characteristics of their voice are explored and any issues recognized. The students will then be provided with an individual work plan supported by regular one-to-one and small group sessions sessions Singing In singing students will explore a range of technical vocal skills required for singing including isolating any vocal issues the student may have and developing individual strategies for vocal development. Studies will include an exploration of:

Vocal Health Breathing Range Pitch Rhythm

Resonance Projection Articulation Harmony Musicality Student will be asked to explore and evaluate their vocal range and develop their musical ear. The module will introduce the students to a range of songs from a variety of genre (musical theatre, religious, popular music and choral) Music Theory Students will follow a lecture and practical class programme through which they develop an understanding of music theory and vocabulary. The particular focus of these session will be the development of the skills and knowledge required of a musical theatre performer in a professional context. Studies will include Music notation Music vocabulary Music theory Music forms
