Outline Syllabus

Organisation and structure of ships, shipping companies and other maritime organisations. Ship management and ship owners – differences of function and responsibility. Functions and departments in a shipping company. Developments in ship organization – dual function officers, general purpose crews. Function and organization of crewing agencies. Multi-cultural crews.

Management theory. Leadership styles. Management skills – motivation, leadership, teamwork, delegation, time management. Communication – interpersonal and organizational. Management style and communication. Barriers to communication. Advice evaluation. Active listening.
