Outline Syllabus	This module will address the type of writing associated with match/event reporting. The content of the module will reflect the practical aspects of the role of a sports journalist and will aim to recreate a number of the settings that sports journalists would routinely face.
Module Overview	The aim of this module is to develop the knowledge and skills required to produce match/event reports across a number of sports. You will work in a number of simulated environments that replicate those that a sports journalist would routinely face, developing the skills and ethical awareness required to enable you to perform as responsible working sports journalists.
Additional Information	The module is designed to equip the would-be sports reporter with the fundamental skills that will enable him/her to operate across a number of journalism platforms. It will cover a range of sports and will deal with the different requirements for each.
