2. The Law of Tort

Negligence. Elements of the tort of Negligence. Nervous Shock. The doctrines of res ipsa loquitur, Contributory negligence and vicarious liability. Strict liability. Liability for negligent misstatement. Remedies in tort.

3. The Law of Contract

Definition of a Contract. Classification of Contracts. Essential elements of a valid simple contract viz an agreement, intention to create legal relations and consideration. Form. Contractual capacity of minors and persons of unsound mind. The doctrine of privity of Contract. Vitiating factors in a Contract (in outline only). Terms of a Contract.

Remedies for breach of contract. Discharge of a contract.

4. Agency. The relationship between principles and agent. Agent's liability for its actions.
