### **Module Content**

Outline Syllabus	1. An exploration of the key techniques required to examine the structure of a play to extract information about the 'world of the play', the characters and their relationships, and the author's intentions. This will end in the performance of a rehearsed reading in which the students will share roles.2. An examination of the techniques required for sight-reading both dramatic and non-dramatic texts, verse and prose. This will end in a sight-reading test in front of appropriate tutors.3. An exploration of key repertoire. This will be explored through research, on-going presentations, play readings and watching plays both recorded and live. (This will be further enhanced by your work in Professional Studies 1 module)
