Outline Syllabus

The module will comprise of a number of location-based workshops which will introduce and/or develop skills in camera formats, lighting, health and safety and general location practices. You will receive tuition on ideas generation based upon the research you have gathered. You will be offered time to practice these technical and creative skills independently. You will be expected to be resourceful and creative in highly challenging environments.

Learning Activities

You will be introduced to a range of location lighting as well as the full range of camera formats. The module will include and promote safe practice on location as well as general working methodologies and practices. Emphasis will be placed on the creative use of camera and lighting techniques and how to generate ideas which are achievable within the constraints of a range of environments.
