Defining groups in society - class, gender, age, family types and minority groups. Overview of socio-cultural and economic factors: Demographics of health and illness; Inequalities in health - socio-economic and cultural factors and life chances/choices across the life-span. Overview: The origins and impact of health and social care policies on nursing care provision. Self, Beliefs, Attitudes and Motivation. Stress and G.A.S. Psychological models of behaviour. Psychological Perspectives on Health. Personality. Perception. Psycho-social impact of hospitalization. Labelling. Sick role. Altered body image The nature of mental illness. Learning.

Overview of collaborative practice/s - the MDT and the care planning cycle. Roles and responsibilities of team members. Client/care involvement. Overview: approaches to care provision and nursing practice: Introductory outline of factors impinging on care practice: Care pathways, Care programme approach and effective care co-ordination. Differentiating between primary, intermediate and continuing care. Identifying psychological health needs.

Learning Activities

Key-note lectures. Individual and group directed enquiry based study activities. Individual tutorial sessions provide the students with formative feedback on their learning achievements and developmental needs. Placement based fieldwork linked to private study time. The use of a mid-point poster presentation, outlining the

evidence collected relating to health needs and service provision for a selected client group will also provide students with formative feedback as to their learning achievements and learning needs for successful completion of the module.
