Aims

This module aims to provide students, whatever their ability or previous experience, with a broad and exciting approach to drawing the human form. It will introduce a wide variety of media, both conventional and unconventional, and apply these to the art of drawing from life.

It aims to develop the student's visualisation and observational skills, with a bold and energetic choice of subjects and spaces. It aims to develop an awareness of the

human figure in space with a sense of rigour and discipline in the students work. It aims to inspire students to make drawing a useful part of their lives and an important tool for self-expression.

Learning Outcomes

After completing the module the student should be able to:

- 1 Use basic materials to develop an understanding of the possibilities of drawing.
- 2 Develop a knowledge of drawing and how it can be used to relate to their main area of study.
- 3 Experiment and express themselves simply and effectively through drawing.
- Be self-motivated in personal study and be able to self evaluate and articulate knowledge gained at the conclusion of the course.

Outline Syllabus

There will be 10 drawing classes. Emphasis will be placed on providing a wide variety of subjects and locations.

These may include some of the following:

Nude Fix poses

Figures in period costume

Figures (nude and clothed) in domestic settings

Figures in huge spaces (cathedrals, halls, theatrical environments)

Figures in motion

Figures in public spaces. Everyday observations

Drawing in mirrors. Self portraiture.

Emphasis will be on using a wide variety of media to express and record observations. These may include:

Pencil/charcoal/pastel on paper and cardboard Using paint and colour Collage and assemblage Simple print making and mark making techniques Working at varying scales

Use of sketchbooks will be encouraged throughout, as will the discipline of constant drawing and observing.

The course will culminate in each student presenting an exhibition of his or her work

and creative process.

Learning Activities

The module will be delivered by a series of weekly drawing classes, private study work, individual tutorials and the final presentation of an individual project. Students will be expected to read around and research the subject and to look at how different artists have represented the human form throughout history.
