Outline Syllabus

Principles of the English legal system: explanation of a classification of law contrasting criminal and civil law; an outline of the history of law identifying the sources of English law; written and unwritten law; review of common law and statute; identification of court structure and explanation of judicial precedent. The legal framework for workplace health and safety within the Leisure and Tourism industry: the tort of negligence; Health and safety legislation Health and Safety at Work Act.
