Outline Syllabus

Outline Syllabus: Through a directed in-house rehearsal to performance process, you will apply many of the principles and working methods learned throughout the year to a character from a naturalistic, psychologically-based larger piece of work where you will have the opportunity to extend your range of skills within a larger context of performance material. The focus of this module is on exploring and critically appraising the processes leading to performance and not simply the performance itself. The module has four phases:

- Planning and research (including taking on production responsibilities)
- Rehearsal strategies and techniques
- Performance
- Critical appraisal

Students are expected to engage with all four elements of the production process. Throughout the module students are required to keep a production logbook in which they reflect upon the process and their understanding of the development of the production. Material within may be used in your tutorial at the end of the term. You are expected to demonstrate an awareness and commitment to professional codes of practice
