### Learning Activities

The WBL (operational) module will be completed by students during their sea phases with the support of a designated WBL module leader at college and materials made available electronically. Learning activities across the whole of the programme feed into the WBL project through specific concepts and underpinning knowledge.

Briefings before departure for the sea phase will allow basic guidance to be given, examples to be studied, and initial questions to be addressed.

The final projects will be marked, and feedback will have an emphasis on improvements for WBL (managerial).

### Notes

This module can contribute to the underpinning knowledge required for progression to an Officer of the Watch professional qualification. The work placement can be completed in an alternate environment to a ship based placement following discussion with the programme leader.
