# **Learning Activities**

Lectures workshops and skills seminar groups will cover a range of aural training recognising and and transcribing intervals, chords, melodies and rhythmic patterns, rhythmic awareness and Latin and African percussion skills.

#### **Notes**

This module runs on a year long basis with weekly aural classes in which learners are streamed according to ability. These sessions, featuring on-going exercise,s test students on a regular basis and provide learners with activities to undertake in their own time in between sessions.

The percussion workshops allow students to engage with a wide range of instruments and rhythmic patterns and culminate in a performance of a percussion piece to their peers.
