Module Content

Outline Syllabus	1. Historical Perspectives on DanceStudents will be introduced to a broad history of Dance from the origin up to the end of the mid-20th Century. This will be delivered broadly chronologically through thematically context-based lectures. The context will be viewed from a global and culturally inclusive perspective linking developments and movements into wider political, cultural, and economic events. Students will also be introduced to research strategies and the skills and vocabulary required to undertake critical evaluation of performing arts practice. 2. Academic Skills and Professional DevelopmentStudents will be introduced to a range of study skills, which will support their academic progression through the programme, including: research skills (gathering, sifting, evaluating, and utilising information), constructing ideas and developing arguments, writing, communication and ICT skills.
