Pre-conception care, miscarriage, ectopic pregnancy, hydatidiform mole, bereavement, hyperemesis, systems based review of the following: epilepsy, cardiac and respiratory disorders, Thromboembolic disorders, compromised immunity hypertensive disease, cholestasis, hematological disorders, rhesus incompatibility, endocrine problems, renal disorders, prolonged and obstructed labour, placental pathology, neonatal and maternal infections, national and global mortality and morbidity, haemoglobinopathies, neonatal jaundice, rhesus iso-immunisation, CVS, amniocentesis., nuchal translucency
