## **Outline Syllabus**

*Undertaking research as a practitioner; writing a research proposal; reviewing the literature; qualitative and quantitative research methods; data collection and analysis; research tools; ethical issues related to research with children and young people*

## **Learning Activities**

Key lectures on primary research methodology, ethics of research, secondary research including the use of Athens. Individual tutorials supporting students to examine an area of their own professional practice. Seminars examining research methodology, ethics and searching electronic journals. Private study to investigate additional sources of information. Work focused activities on individual research. Guided reading.

## **Notes**

The main basis of this module is to provide students with an enhanced awareness of academic research. The advantages and limitations of quantitative and qualitative research methodologies will be examined and evaluated. Students will be expected to search the literature, including the use of electronic databases, to investigate an area of their professional practice in more depth. They will then be expected to

produce a small scale research proposal in this area; then test and evaluate one of the methodological tools proposed.
