Outline Syllabus

Scanario based packages will reflect the current client group (including biological, psychological and social basis of mental illness/distress), clients with complex needs service user and carer issues and relevance to the current mental health service initiatives

Collaborative/interagency working practices. Engaging service users and carers. Assessment skills. Documentation, storage and retrieval of information. Information gathering and analysis. Understanding of specialist therapeutic skills. Therapeutic skills. CBT skills for a range of mental health problems, PSI, family interventions, crisis intervention skills. Risk assessment, Client education strategies, monitoring therapeutic interventions. Measurement and evaluation of interventions. Clinical supervision and reflection.
