Nursing Practice

Learning Activities

The module will utilise a range of teaching and learning strategies including lectures, tutorials, scenario focused discussions, Blackboard activities and reflections on practice.

Students will also complete a period of work-based learning on a practice placement. This practice learning is reflected in the 66hrs of Other learning

It will build on the fundamental issues highlighted in the foundation programme and utilize opportunities and experiences within the workplace.
