Outline Syllabus

The nature of urban deprivation and inner city problems: economic; social; physical and fiscal dimensions.

Consideration and evaluation of:

- *urban regeneration agencies and agencies responsible for housing;*
- *the funding of urban regeneration;*
- *good and bad practice in area regeneration and housing maintenance;*

The maintenance of private sector housing stock and determination of the suitability of houses for occupation.

Housing legislation, statutory instruments and guidelines.

Conducting housing inspections and writing inspection reports giving consideration to the level of risk and identifying the most appropriate course of action to achieve compliance with statutory instruments, codes of practice and government guidance.

Public health issues within Environmental health such as drainage, waste and nuisance
