Notes

This module will equip students with the knowledge and skills required to meet the

competencies of the nursing associate

role. In addition to the ongoing rehearsal of skills associated with medicines management and health promotion the focus of

this module will be on the development of skills that support learning and assessment in practice. This will facilitate the

development of key transferable skills to enable students to teach a range of people including peers, families and service

users. The consolidation of these skills will occur in practice where students will be supported and assessed by

appropriately prepared health care professionals.

The Shape of Caring Review (2015) places an emphasis on strengthening the capacity and skills of the nursing workforce.

A key driver for this is the ability to contribute positively to the learning of others enabling them to improve their health and well-being. The nursing associate has a pivotal role in providing support to the Registered Nurse, to encourage families and service users to be partners in their care and will therefore require the underpinning knowledge and skills to perform effectively.

Formative Assessment: 1. The formative assessment will include the development of numeracy skills in the form of a maths test.

2. Completion of year 2 Personal Development Plan (PDP) linking theory to clinical and care skills.

3. A formative simulated teaching activity where peers will provide feedback on individual performance

4. A simulated management of medication where feedback will be provided in anticipation of summative assessments.

5. An on line anatomy and physiology quiz

6. Timely Supervisor feedback on progress towards the achievement of the summative assessment requirements as

identified within the PAR. This would normally take place half way through the module within the work based setting.

Competency is assessed via completion of the Practice Assessment Record which must be passed to pass the module.
