# **Outline Syllabus**

Transitional care, low birth weight, small for gestational age, prematurity, baby friendly initiatives, neonatal infections, neonatal jaundice, clefts, thermoreguation, feeding regimes, phototherapy, jittery baby, grunting baby, neonatal abstinence syndrome, genetic inheritance, ethics of care and care provision and pharmacology.
