#### **Aims**

To introduce the student to the fundamental principles of law relating to the substantive criminal law relating to property.

## **Outline Syllabus**

The syllabus will cover the following:

- (i) theft
- (ii) fraud and forgery
- (iii) burglary, robbery and blackmail
- (iv) handling stolen goods and going equipped
- (v) taking a conveyance without consent and aggravated vehicle taking
- (vi) criminal damage

## **Learning Activities**

Student will gain a sufficient awareness of the main principles and how such

principles are applied. In seminars student will be rigourly probed and tested against their knowledge to a seres of challenging questions which will be given out in advance and the expectation that the student will be fully prepared to discuss their findings.

#### **Notes**

The course will follow the traditional format of lectures together with intensive and detailed seminar discussion and analysis. The property team will be available throughout the delivery of the course to assist students with their learning.

Assessment of the course is by one piece of written coursework (2500-3000 word limit) and end of course unseen examination lasting 2 hours. The coursework and examination are equally weighted at 50% each.
