Outline Syllabus

Psychology in areas of application (clinical, occupational, community, educational); Preparation for placement and transferable skills.

Placement: one twenty hour placement chosen from areas of clinical, educational, industrial, organisational and community settings. A number of these optional visits will be arranged to allow students to see psychology in the workplace.

Learning Activities

Several areas of applied psychology are introduced by a professional in the field. The placement (minimum of 20 hours) may require a wide variety of activities. The module is delivered through lectures and small group teaching. Each student will give a short seminar presentation to a small group of peers and produce a report based on their work placement.
