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## Notes

This module aims to introduce the student to the historical, political and cultural issues relating to migration, and the subsequent emergence of ethnic minority groups. It is now recognised that these groups are at greater risk of ill health and have more disadvantaged life experiences than the population at large. The policies and initiatives to address these imbalances will be discussed.

The first assessment essay covers the historical aspects of migration while the second essay analyses effects of social exclusion and other stresses on health of ethnic minority groups.
