Module Overview	The aim of this module is to be able to safely and effectively demonstrate a range of clinical skills in the out of hospital arena with respect to the environment and situations encountered.
Additional Information	With the introduction of invasive techniques and advanced skills it is extremely important to remember that these complement basic skills. Learners should be practising their basic skills constantly to ensure that the patient receives the best treatment possible. The module has been designed to provide learners with knowledge and skills in an appropriate order. As their skills increase they will have the opportunity to use them in scenarios. In this way the complexity of their work will increase very quickly, but at a rate that is sensible and appropriate. Learners will only develop consistency and accuracy with practice. The OSCE challenges the learners patient assessment skills, decision making and clinical management and is also a pass or a fail. As this module is intrinsically linked to practice, the Practice Learning & Assessment Documentation (PLAD) must be completed fully in all relevant sections for this semester. Relevant aspects of the skills log must be signed as competent to be accepted as a pass. The PLAD is recorded as a 'pass' or 'fail' and the document will be continued onto the next practice module, 5009PM.
