Outline Syllabus

Students will be introduced to and undertake a second fieldwork placement. They will be supported in their development as a professional youth and community worker throughout Level Two.

Phase One: Preparation for Fieldwork Practice, Second Fieldwork Placement and professional development workshops.

Phase Two: professional development workshops leading to readiness for full time work

- Placement and organisation and Placement Handbook
- The Placement Learning Contract, Tasks and Learning Outcomes
- The roles and responsibilities of a JNC Level Two worker
- Methods of monitoring student progress and evidence required for Assessment
- Supervision and professional development
- Critical thinking skills, becoming a reflective practitioner
- Conflict management, dealing with difficult situations, de-escalating techniques.

Fieldwork Practice:

- Establish, work to review the placement learning contract, through supervision and review, meetings.

- Offer field-based learning experiences with a minimum of 50% of work directly with young people and communities.
