Learning Activities

1. This is a practical studio based module supported by a programme of PDP tutorials, seminars, WoW events, studio visits, professional practice lectures and portfolio workshops.

Students engage in a variety of work placements and/or team-based projects.
This module is yearlong. A series of PDP tutorials, industry talks and WoW and portfolio events take place primarily in in the early part of the year, preparing students for a work placements and/or team-based project in the later part of the year.

4. The final assessment for this module is 50% Reflection (comprising PDP progress file, reflective journal or blog and CV) and 50% Portfolio (comprising placement and/or project work).

5. Formative written feedback is given in response to PDP tutorial reviews at the start of semester 2.

6. On-going informal feedback will be available via tutorial and seminars.
