Outline Syllabus

What is leadership and the role and challenges of the leader in contemporary dynamic organisations.

Understanding leaders, their traits, skills, abilities and style will be explored. Approaches to understanding the relationship between leaders and followers, particularly situational, contingency and path-goal theories.

Theory and models describing contemporary organisations and strategic leadership and decision making. Transactional leadership theory, transformational leadership theory, team leadership and psychodynamic approaches to analysing leadership will be developed.

Learning Activities

A range of pedagogical methods will be used for learning. Within sessions formal academic input will act as a means of providing students with the appropriate theoretical knowledge. To enhance the teaching of this module a range of practical approaches will be used. These will include case-studies, role-plays, decision

making and problem solving activities, leader-group discussions, student presentations. Formative assessment will also be used in the form of two multiple choice tests and the option of peer review of leading in-class group discussions.
