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Notes

The first block of this module focuses on developing specific filmmaking skills, namely lighting and sound design. Students have the opportunity to gain hands-on experience in the studio and on location and will produce a practical portfolio that aims to assess skill acquisition.

The second block of the module allows students to produce their own short (10 minute) fiction film. Emphasis here is placed assessing pre-production planning and implementation of practical skills.

Students will produce a 1000 word critical reflection, which aims to assess critical

engagement with the practical projects.
