#### **Notes**

A learning agreement between the student and the tutor will ensure that a structure is in place for each student to achieve the learning outcomes of the module. The module will also enable students to achieve the World of Work efficacies of self-awareness, organisational awareness and 'making things happen' (project management), should they wish to avail themselves of this opportunity. Lectures and workshops will provide additional guidance about project design and management, employment, career planning and WoW, and will allow current and former students to share their good practice.
