Outline Syllabus

Students will undertake more detailed study of the structures of particular types of film and TV programme with regard to the primacy of storytelling through techniques such as 3-Act or 'Classic Hollywood' structure. Students will examine the use of step outlines/treatments and character biographies as an aid to structuring a script. Students will further study screenplay formatting and develop their understanding of the dramatic potential of the form. Students will undertake a series of related exercises. The syllabus will be delivered in workshop/small group sessions, peer criticism will be encouraged in conjunction with class discussion and one-to-one tuition.
