To research, write and produce clear, well-written, accurate and engaging stories for radio and/or television and relevant digital platformsTo demonstrate familiarity with the basic techniques of recording audio, filming and editing material for TV and/or radio broadcastTo be familiar with the language, terminology and conventions of a broadcast newsroom and understand how to put a short bulletin together for broadcast media outlets. ## **Module Content**

Outline Syllabus	Students will learn how to research, write and produce high-quality, professional standard reports for radio and/or TV. They will develop research skills in sourcing original stories and producing them ethically and accurately for broadcast. Students will become familiar with the technology, techniques, language and conventions of broadcast newsrooms; using electronic newsroom systems, recording audio, filming and editing to produce material in line with current professional broadcast practice. They will be expected to demonstrate developing skills in writing for broadcast including structure, introductions, understanding story treatments and writing to pictures. This module is designed to reflect the best current practice in broadcast newsrooms in the UK.
