# **Module Content**

Outline Syllabus	Teaching on the module will be organised into three blocks, each focussing on one of the module's title themes. Each block will introduce students to different literary genres (poetry, drama, fictional and non-fictional prose) and cultural forms and will identify issues of relevant historical transformation and resistance.
Module Overview	The aim of this module is to introduce you to a range of seventeenth-century writings in their historical and cultural context to enable you to recognise different forms and genres used in the period. This module will also facilitate an understanding the concept of the Early Modern and issues of historical change and continuity.
Additional Information	The first assignment will ask students to choose an appropriate text from the Early English Books Online (EEBO) database, to edit this text for a modern reader, and to provide a critical introduction to it.
