### **Outline Syllabus**

Psychology in areas of application (clinical, occupational, community, educational); Preparation for placement and transferable skills.

Placement: one twenty hour placement chosen from areas of clinical, educational, industrial, organisational and community settings.

### **Learning Activities**

Several areas of applied psychology are introduced by a professional in the field. The placement (minimum of 20 hours) may require a wide variety of activities. The module is delivered through lectures and small group teaching. The students will have a number of self assessment and self reflection opportunities. Each student will

give a short seminar presentation to a small group of peers and produce a report based on their work placement.

#### **Notes**

This module discusses psychology in application. It aims to raise students' awareness of various career paths and opportunities in psychology. Students complete a minimum of twenty hours in an applied setting. The work placement presents an opportunity for each student to obtain experience in a professional area. Students must complete the necessary paperwork prior to the placement - this is a requirement of the module and credit will not be released if the paperwork is not in order.
