Bespoke training will be offered depending on the placements and their proposed outputs, including sessions run in conjunction with Student Futures and Skills@LJMU. There may be field visits to relevant sites as part of the preparatory work. Upon completion of the module, students will have received valuable training and experience, reflected critically on the development of skills, will be able to articulate that experience on a CV, cover letter, and on a profile on the platform LinkedIn, and produced a project report.
