Outline Syllabus

Observance of good Health and Safety within skill based workshops. The module will have cumulative activities to build upon technical skills and knowledge related to the Principles of Pattern Construction gained at level 4, for more advanced styling adaptations and methods of producing patterns including modelling. The module will aid students in their ability to investigate experiment, analyse and practically produce patterns linked to design projects. Students will evaluate final conclusions. Students will also apply manual grading and lay planning knowledge and will further extend grading and lay planning skills by using CAD part of the fashion professional practice portfolio.

Learning Activities

These are tailored to enable students to gain appropriate skills to produce patterns with practical knowledge and understanding of its position within the design and production process. Activities will encourage students to be self- motivated and

working to a more advanced level with experimentation and critical analysis. Coursework will be assessed by the completion of a reflective reference file of a variety of more advanced styling adaptations related to mini collection, with appropriate production considerations. Student will produce patterns and toile to test styling details. Students will also produce full scale grading. Students will attend workshop sessions, Listen to lectures and demonstrations and work with a combination of supervise study and independent learning through practical application, experimentation and analysis.

On - going informal feedback will be given in weekly practical sessions.
