Outline Syllabus

Current health policies for treatment of hospital in-patients; out-patients and care in the community; Health education and individual responsibility for maintaining well being eg diet, exercise, alcohol and drug use; The growth of health promotion; The changing NHS and the advancement of new technologies in healthcare; The impact of class, gender, age, ethnicity on healthcare; 21st century disease and illnesses; Patient choice

Learning Activities

Participation in class discussion and seminar presentations with particular focus on social determinants of health and their impact. Critically evaluation of media reports on health provision and health promotion. Research areas of health promotion. Literature review of health and illness journal articles on the changing NHS and its roles and responsibilities. Researching prevalence and causes of 21st century diseases.

Notes

Students will be encouraged to look at the responsibilities of the individual in maintaining wellbeing. The changing NHS will be examined primarily focusing on the use of technology; the promotion of public health and health education. The social determinants of health will be identified and their contribution to health and

illness examined. Students will look at 21st century illnesses' and their causes and compare these with illnesses that were most prevalent in the early years of the 20th century.
