Outline Syllabus

This module will give the opportunity to students to create an e-portfolio demonstrating students' professional development and future career prospects. Student will also present in their portfolio the outcomes from their work placement completed at the end of the Level 4 programme. Throughout this module, students will have the opportunity to attend presentations and career talks given by professionals from the fashion industry and visits professional environment. Students will also be encouraged to participate in competitions, live-briefs to enhance their portfolio and professional practices working both individually and in groups. Students will have to work as a team in the organisation and promotion of their graduate static show. Students will apply more advanced CAD skills in the production of their portfolio. This will involve using a variety of specific fashion software for design visualisation and to develop image manipulation techniques. Student will extend their skills in pattern construction and pattern manipulation using Gerber Accumark system. Students will professionally present the full process of the design and development of their products for their mini collection for a specific sector and market.

Learning Activities

Students will be introduced through lectures to a range of career opportunities in the fashion and textile industry.

Lectures will also be delivered to give a general knowledge of the different market sectors, processes in the design and development of fashion products, job profiles and requirements, and businesses opportunities.

Throughout this module, students will have the opportunity to attend presentations and career talks given by professionals from the fashion industry and visits professional environment.

Students will also be encouraged to participate in competitions, live-briefs to enhance their portfolio and professional practices working both individually and in groups. Students will have to work as a team in the organisation and promotion of their graduate static show.

Workshops will be delivered to introduce techniques to create portfolio and to introduce CAD advanced applications to enhance work related to Design and Pattern Technology modules.

Students will also research creative and innovative portfolio presentations by looking at content and presentation of professional portfolios from different careers, from graduates and also by researching innovative and creative presentation techniques. Those workshops will offer opportunities for individual lead technical project activities.
